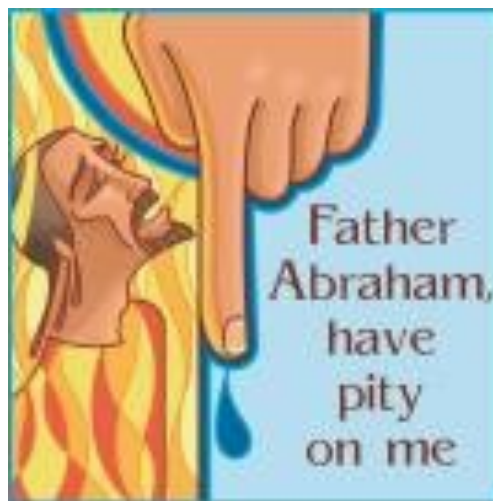

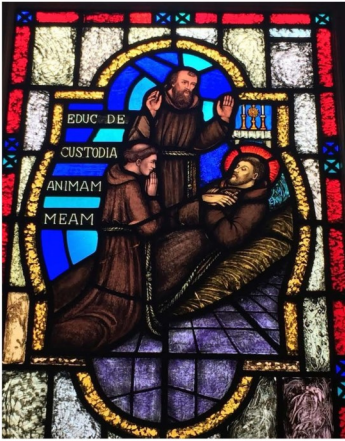

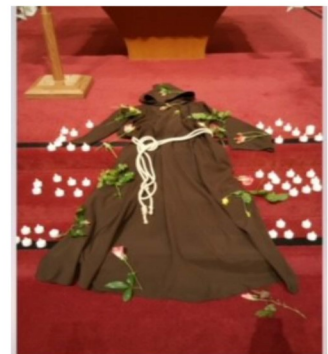
"Bring my soul to Thee Lord"
