

PERSISTENCE


Exodus recounts the journey of the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt to the land promised to their ancestors. It was not an easy journey. In today's reading, they are attacked by Amalek and his soldiers, members of one of the peoples who live in the land through which the Israelites are traveling. Moses was on the hilltop with his arms raised to invoke the LORD's assistance in the battle below, a powerful illustration of the LORD's favor upon Israel. If the soldiers were to lift up their eyes to that hill (see Psalm 121:1), they would be reassured by Moses's presence and posture. Paul urges the Thessalonians to persist in proclaiming the gospel, and Jesus likewise commends the widow for her persistence in pursuit of the justice due her. Whether they preach or pray, the followers of Jesus need persistence through periods of difficulty.






Catholics United to Protect and Support Women, Children and Families

Proposition 1 is a worst-case scenario for abortion in California. It is an expensive and misleading ballot measure that allows unlimited lateterm abortions — for any reason, at any time, even moments before birth, paid for by tax dollars.





Serve Neighbors in Need

- Home visits. OLA-SVDP members serve in the Burlingame area providing emergency assistance. Thanks to your donations, we bring bags of groceries and purchase Safeway gift cards for eggs, milk, fresh fruits and vegetables, and other perishables. Food is the most common request.
- Urgent aid. Emergency rental assistance to keep families in place and avoid homelessness, when possible.
- Other assistance. Fulfill requests for clothing, utility support and essential furniture such as beds.
- Prayer and friendship. We seek to bring Christ's love through friendship and service to our neighbors in need.
 We also share homemade holiday treats and provide back-to-school support.

OLA's St. Vincent de Paul Conference helps single moms and their children, the elderly, disabled or mentally ill, others in need. Conference members are parishioners. Our help is confidential, and we serve regardless of a person's faith.

Serve Those with No Home

We assist the SVDP San Mateo Homeless Help Center with:

- Meals. Over 3000 brown bag lunches provided so that those who are hungry have weekend meals.
- Holiday assistance. 300 McDonald's meal certificates and 150 Safeway gift cards given to the Homeless Help Center for distribution to the needy.
- Personal care kits. 125 care kits made and distributed.

Support critical needs

- OLA-SVDP collaborates with SVDP Conferences in Half Moon Bay and Pescadero to assist farm workers and others in need along the coast.
- Restorative Justice through San Mateo County's SVDP's Catherine's Center and jail ministry. Women released from incarceration and accepted into SVDP's Catherine Center, work to finish school, build self-esteem, get jobs and learn skills to care for themselves and their children. SVDP jail ministry serves the incarcerated in San Mateo County.
